

## Hazardous Waste

Paints, pesticides, propane tanks, batteries, syringes, used motor oil and many cleaning products are just some examples of household hazardous wastes, which are used daily by residents. These items contain toxic ingredients and should be used and disposed of with caution. Do not place out for regular garbage pick-up. Please do not pour motor oil, paints or solvents down your drain or into sewers.

Household Hazardous Waste **WILL NOT** be collected with your garbage or recyclables.

Residents of Drummond/North Elmsley have access to the Carleton Place Hazardous Waste Depot

LOCATION: 128 Patterson Crescent, Carleton Place.

DIRECTIONS: From Highway 7 turn left onto McNeely, left again onto Patterson, Depot is on the right

OPENED: Saturday mornings May 16, 2015 through to August 29, 2015

HOURS: Saturday mornings 8 a.m. to 12 noon

### Household Hazardous Waste Depot

Waste items Must Be Identifiable and in a Sealed Container or Package.

**You will be asked for identification**

This facility can no longer bulk flammable or highly vaporous liquids - therefore any containers holding these liquids will not be returned. (example is gasoline containers)

### Waste Items Accepted

- ❖ ACID OR BASE CORROSIVES (*CLEANERS, DRAIN OPENERS, RUST REMOVER*)
- ❖ AEROSOL CANS
- ❖ FIRE EXTINGUISHERS
- ❖ FLAMMABLE LIQUIDS (*GASOLINE, SOLVENTS, STRIPPERS, TURPENTINE*)
- ❖ FLUORESCENT LIGHT BULBS AND 48" TUBES
- ❖ LATEX PAINT, OIL PAINT & STAIN
- ❖ LEAD ACID VEHICLE BATTERIES OR DRY CELL BATTERIES
- ❖ MERCURY (*MERCURY FILLED THERMOMETERS, THERMOSTATS*)
- ❖ MOTOR OIL, ANTIFREEZE, OIL FILTERS
- ❖ ORGANIC FLAMMABLE (*ADHESIVES, DRIVEWAY SEALANT, CAULK, RESIN*)
- ❖ OXIDIZERS (*POOL CHEMICALS, FERTILIZER*)
- ❖ PESTICIDE
- ❖ PROPANE CYLINDERS

### **Waste Items Not Accepted**

- ❖ AMMUNITION, EXPLOSIVES OR FLARES
- ❖ ASBESTOS
- ❖ OXYGEN, FREON OR ACETYLENE GAS
- ❖ P.C.B. CONTAMINATED WASTE (*FLUORESCENT LIGHT BALLASTS*)
- ❖ PATHOLOGICAL WASTE (*SYRINGES*)

### **Household Hazardous Waste Depot**

#### **What To Do With Waste Items That Are Not Accepted**

The Province of Ontario mandates which materials we are legally allowed to accept and which ones we are not. We have attempted to compile the following information in order to ease your search to find a lawful and easy method to dispose of materials that are not handled by our HHW Depot. This is in no means meant to be a complete listing but more of a guideline to assist you to find local merchants. We thank you for your continued efforts to reduce the amount of products going to our landfill sites.

- AMMUNITION OR EXPLOSIVES  
Take to any detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police. It is best to take it during regular business hours during the week.
- ASBESTOS  
The homeowner should never handle asbestos. Please call a licensed demolition expert.
- CONSTRUCTION WASTE  
This can be taken to the Code Landfill or Glenview Iron and Metal Hwy 43 West in Smiths Falls 613-283-5230.
- ELECTRONICS  
Drummond/North Elmsley residents may recycle their electronics at the Code Road Landfill site free of charge.
- OXYGEN, FREON OR ACETYLENE GAS  
Most bottles will have the company name imprinted on the side that initially supplied the bottle. These companies will take them back. BOC is one such company and they can be reached at 613-745-9455.
- P.C.B. CONTAMINATED WASTE (*FLUORESCENT LIGHT BALLASTS*)  
Ballasts manufactured prior to 1979 could contain PCB's. After 1979 they do not contain PCB's but they contain oil and should not be disposed of in a landfill site. Safety Kleen

Canada Inc. will recycle these products but the cost is high. A 20 litre pail of ballasts without PCB's costs \$84. With PCB's costs \$210.

- **PATHOLOGICAL WASTE (*SYRINGES*)**  
These can be taken back to the drug stores where they were originally purchased. Syringes must be placed in a hard plastic container for safety purposes.
- **PHARMACEUTICALS (*PRESCRIPTION OR NON PRESCRIPTION DRUGS FOR HUMAN OR VETERINARY USE*)**  
Human prescription drugs can be taken back to the original dispensing pharmacy. Veterinary drugs can be taken back to the dispensing Vet such as Mississippi Veterinary Services or Carleton Place Veterinary Hospital.
- **RAILWAY TIES**  
Glenview Iron and Metal in Smiths Falls accepts railway ties.
- **TIRES**  
Drummond/North Elmsley residents may dispose of their tires at the Code Road Landfill site free of charge if the tires are not on rims and at a charge of \$7 per tire if on a rim.
